SECTION 1: Awareness Check

Do They Notice Flowers?

Check all that apply:

- They point out flowers during walks or outings
- They've mentioned liking fresh flowers in the home

Decoder Insight:

SECTION 2: Observation Patterns

How Do They Interact With Flowers?

- They admire arrangements longer than expected
- They touch, smell, or rearrange flowers when present

Decoder Insight:

Interaction = Interest. Repeated interaction = Desire.

 **SECTION 3: Language Decoder****What Do They Say — and What It Usually Means**

Check statements you've heard:

- “Flowers are really pretty”
- “I love thoughtful gestures”
- “You don’t have to get me anything”
- “I like when people do little things”
- “That bouquet is beautiful” (about someone else’s flowers)

Decoder Translation:

- “You don’t have to” ≠ “I don’t want”
- Compliments = Invitations
- Soft tone = Emotional openness

2+ statements = A quiet green light

 **SECTION 4: Emotional Needs Decoder****What Might Flowers Fulfill for Them?**

Check emotional patterns you notice:

- They crave reassurance or comfort
- They appreciate being remembered
- They respond deeply to sentimental gestures
- They value intention over cost

- They feel loved through presence and care

Decoder Insight:

Flowers often represent *emotional safety*, not material desire.



SECTION 5: Personality & Lifestyle Decoder

Does Their Lifestyle Align With Floral Gifting?

- They enjoy cozy or aesthetic environments
- They romanticize everyday moments
- They like candles, soft lighting, or décor
- They prefer meaningful gifts over flashy ones
- They enjoy rituals, routines, or seasonal traditions

Decoder Insight:

A lifestyle rooted in beauty and intention pairs naturally with flowers.



SECTION 6: Timing Decoder

When Would Flowers Mean the Most?

Check what applies:

- After a stressful or emotional day
- On ordinary days, not just milestones
- During seasonal changes
- After personal achievements
- When words feel insufficient

Decoder Insight:

Unexpected timing increases emotional impact more than price.



SECTION 7: Resistance Decoder

Why They Might Not Ask Directly

- They avoid feeling needy
- They don't want to create pressure
- They value being noticed without asking
- They've learned not to express wants openly
- They fear disappointment

Decoder Insight:

Silence often means *hope*, not disinterest.
